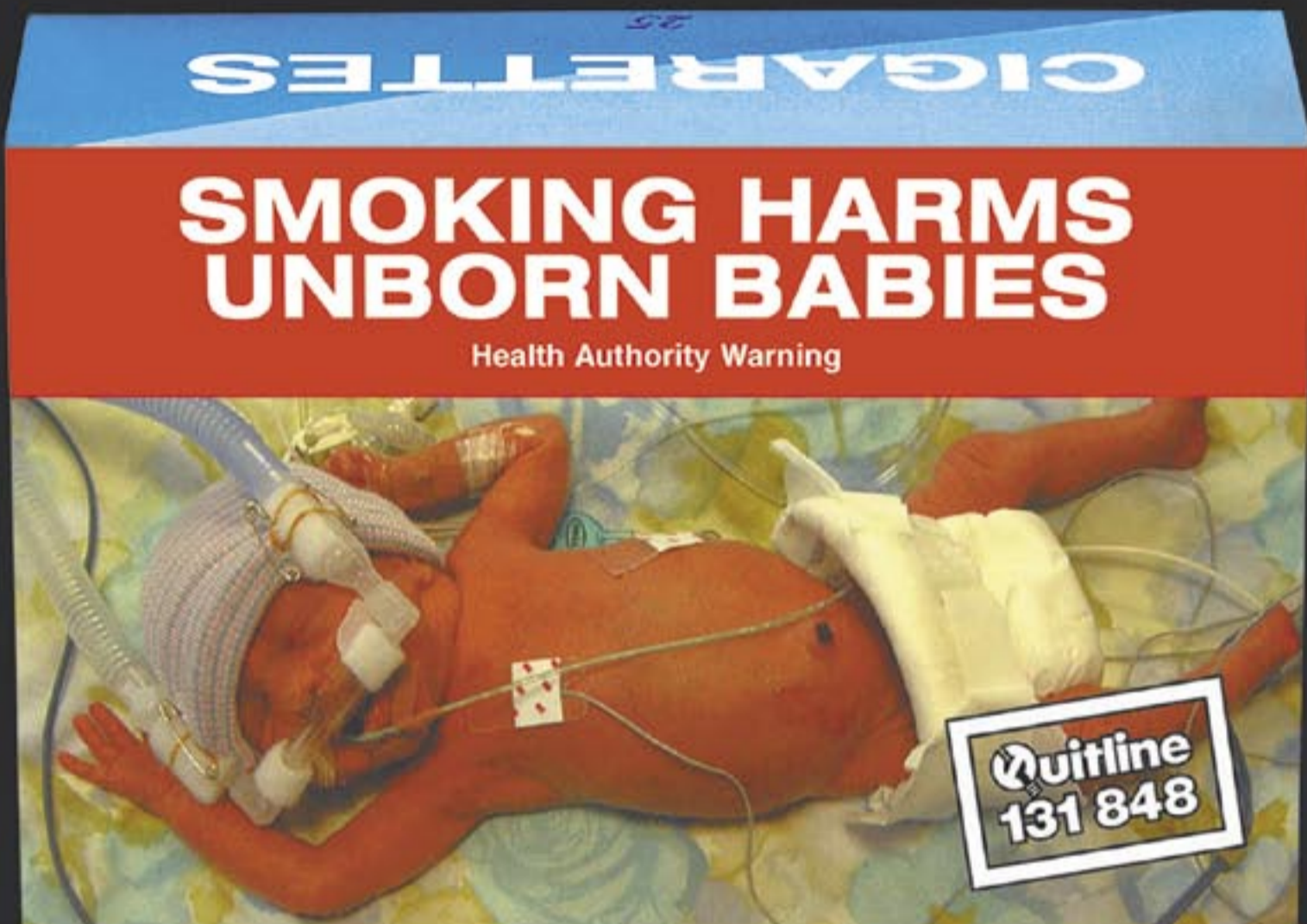


The effects of smoking are now plainer to see
